Accelerates initiative to preserve environment by protecting snow as a resource

Powering all of its 7 ski resorts with 100% renewable energy and supporting zero-carbon initiatives of snow community

Tokyu Land Corporation and Tokyu Resorts & Stays Co., Ltd. announce that they are stepping up efforts to preserve the environment to protect snow resources, which Tokyu Snow Resort has worked on, and handing down the joy of playing in snowy mountains and magnificent nature to the next generation.



■ Background of initiative

In the extremely uncertain long-term business environment as the world is going digital quickly and shifting to a zero-carbon society and as lifestyles are diversifying, Tokyu Land is creating communities friendly to humans and the environment by expanding the renewable energy business to drive sustainable growth.

Especially, the environment surrounding ski and snow resorts may be seriously affected by the rise of temperatures due to global warming, ocean warming around Japan, decreasing snowfall and snow accumulation, and natural disasters associated with changing snow conditions. At the same time, snow resorts

are positioned as a social infrastructure for local businesses. Initiatives to preserve the environment and address climate change are essential for local sustainability. Taking the current environmental change seriously, Tokyu Land is accelerating initiatives to preserve the environment to ensure the sustainability of ski resorts and winter sports-related businesses both today and in the future.


Initiative (1): Completed transition to 100% renewable energy at Tokyu Snow Resort's 7 ski resorts

In December 2022, Tokyu Resorts & Stays completed transition to 100% renewable energy at all 7 ski resorts owned by Tokyu Land by utilizing Tokyu Land's renewable power plants. This can reduce about 8,000 tons of CO2 emissions annually,^{*1} which is equivalent to CO2 emissions of about 4,000 general households.^{*2}

- *1 CO2 emissions: Calculated based on 435 g-CO2/kWh, the national average CO2 emissions factor according to the emissions factors of electricity utility companies (actual results in FY2021) published by the Ministry of the Environment and the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry
- *2 Calculated based on energy consumption per household of 4,743 kW/year (according to the Japan Photovoltaic Energy Association's FY2022 representations guidelines)

Tokyu Land entered into the renewable energy business in 2014, and is operating solar, wind power, and biomass power stations under the ReENE business brand across Japan. Having 96 projects with a rated capacity of more than 1.6 GW as of the end of October 2023, Tokyu Land is a leading renewable energy provider in Japan in terms of business scale. Non-fossil certificates with tracking*3 for renewable energy generated at Tokyu Land's broad network of power stations across Japan are used at 7 Tokyu Snow Resort facilities to show that gondola and chair lifts and restaurants at these facilities are 100% powered by renewable energy.

*3 Non-fossil certificate with tracking: A certificate that allows tracking to show that the renewable energy has been sourced from a relevant power station by connecting the certificate with the attribute data of environmental value generated by the renewable power station





Initiative (2): Partnership with POW JAPAN

Tokyu Resorts & Stays signed a partnership agreement with Protect Our Winters ("POW") Japan on Tuesday October 24, 2023 to support their activities to address climate change.

Professional snowboarder Jeremy Jones, who has led the global snow scene for many years, saw firsthand the early impacts of climate change on "snow and winter." His passion that the snow community should do something to "protect the winter" from this crisis led to the establishment of POW in 2007. Initiative (3): Japan's first experimental social implementation of power generated from snow

Tokyu Land will use a part of Niseko Tokyu Grand Hirafu Ski Resort to evaluate the potential social implementation of power generated from snow, which poses a challenge for people living in snowy regions. This is a joint project with Forte Co., Ltd. and Enoki Lab (University of Electro-Communications).

Initiative (4): Developing environmentally friendly non-fluorinated waxes

Fluorine compounds contained in many waxes used for skis and snowboards are slow to degrade naturally and could have a negative impact on the environment. To address this, Tokyu is developing and marketing fluoro-free wax products. Non-fluorinated waxes use raw materials friendly to the environment and humans while delivering an excellent sliding performance on all snow types.

Tokyu Resorts & Stays have sold the products at Tokyu Snow Resort facilities since January 2023.



Initiative (5): Katsuyama nature school, opportunity to learn the value of natural environments

At Ski Jam Katsuyama in Fukui Prefecture, Tokyu offers Katsuyama nature school, an educational program to learn about the global environment at a ski resort surrounded by nature. Participants can learn the value of natural environments through their five senses.
