# The first selection for the 2022 Airport Decarbonization Promotion Project Cost Subsidy Carport-Model Solar Power Station to Be Built at Sendai Airport -Intended to promote the carbonization of the airport-

Toyota Tsusho Corporation (Head Office: Nagoya-shi, Aichi; President: Ichiro Kashitani; "Toyota Tsusho" below), Tokyu Land Corporation (Headquarters: Shibuya-ku, Tokyo; President and CEO: Masashi Okada; "Tokyo Land" below) and Tohoku Electric Power Co., Inc. (Head Office: Sendai-shi, Miyagi; President and Representative Director: Kojiro Higuchi) announce that the three companies have built a carport-model solar power station ("power station" below) inside Visitor Parking Area 1 at Sendai Airport, which is managed and operated by Sendai International Airport Co., Ltd. (Headquarters: Natori City, Miyagi; Chief Executive Officer: Akito Toba).

All electric power generated by the power station will be used at the Sendai Airport Passenger Terminal Building (accounting for approximately 20% of the building's entire power consumption). Alongside this, with the building of a carport, the three companies will endeavor to make it more convenient for people to use the airport.

Additionally, this project will carry out operations as the first project selected for the "2022 Airport Decarbonization Promotion Project Cost Subsidy (Projects Pertaining Introduction of Solar Energy or Another Form of Renewable Energy)" offered by the Civil Aviation Bureau under the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism.

With a view to the decarbonization of the aviation and airport sectors, the following was positioned under the

Sixth Strategic Energy Plan (decided by the Cabinet in October 2021): "Promoting initiatives such as (1) the introduction of new technology in equipment, accessories, etc., (2) the improvement of operation methods through the sophistication of air-traffic control, (3) the promotion of the introduction of SAF\*1 and (4) the reduction of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions by airport facilities and airport vehicles as well as examining and initiating measures to make airports renewable energy centers and pursuing initiatives for public-private partnerships." The Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism and the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry have newly established review meetings, etc. on the decarbonization of the aviation and airport sectors (eight instances since March 2021). Through this business, Toyota Tsusho, Tokyu Land and Tohoku Electric Power will aim to contribute to the decarbonization being tackled by the Japanese national government.
